
Main research funding organisation in Flanders for:


Fundamental Research, Strategic Basic Research, and Research Infrastructure





#### Budget 2023: 406 MEUR












Figuur 10. De belangrijkste co-publicatielinks van Vlaanderen in de periode <u>2007-2012</u>


Figuur 11. De belangrijkste co-publicatielinks van Vlaanderen in de periode <u>2014-2019</u>

# International collaboration opportunities in 'national' programmes

#### Research projects (Money-Follows-Collaboration)

- Junior/Senior FWO research projects: max. 10% total budget for non-Flemish research institutions (call currently open, DL: April 2<sup>nd</sup>)
- Applied Biomedical Research (TBM)/Strategic
   Basic Research (SBO) projects: max. 20% of total budget for non-Flemish research institutions

#### 2023 call for JR/SR research projects:

3 funded projects include UK research institutions: UCL, Imperial College London, King's College London that receive combined 125K EUR of FWO funding

#### **Fellowships**

- PhD fellowship fundamental research/strategic basic research (open to all nationalities) (calls currently open, DL: March 1<sup>st</sup>)
- <u>Junior/senior postdoctoral fellowship</u> (open to all nationalities)

#### Attracting top talent from abroad



- Attracting Top Scientists to Flanders Universities in Flanders nominate candidates
- No nationality restrictions, but candidate main appointment of min. 80% at foreign institution on FWO-deadline + other eligibility criteria (see regulations)
- Start-up funding to develop a research group or to set up a research line at a Flemish university
- Two-yearly call. Next call opens in April 2024 > FWO-deadline: 30<sup>th</sup> of September 2024

#### TYPE I

- Internationally recognized leading researchers
- Budget: between € 400.000 and €700.000 per year (max. 5 years)
- Permanent position at a university in the Flemish Community

#### TYPE II

- Researchers with the potential to grow to a leading position
- Budget: between € 100.000 and €
   200.000 per year (max. 5 years)
- Tenure track position at a university in the Flemish Community



### Individual International Mobility

#### **OUTGOING**

From Flanders to UK

- Conference abroad
- Workshop/course abroad
- Short/Long stay abroad

#### **Destination UK (2023):**

- Top 2-5 destination
- On average: 7,5% of allocated mobility grants

No call, continuous submission system (submission no later than 3 months prior to departure)



### Individual International Mobility

**INCOMING** 

From abroad (eg. UK) to Flanders Incoming scientific stay in Flanders

#### Who?

Researchers <u>from postdoctoral level</u> onwards, appointed min. 50% outside Belgium – open to all nationalities

#### What?

Scientific stay in Flanders of min. 1 – max. 3 months

Added value for (research group in) Flanders is

crucial: has to be scientifically motivated in depth

FWO funding for travel + daily allowance

No call, continuous submission system (submission no later than 3 months prior to departure)



### **International Networks**

Organisation conference in BE

Scientific Research
Network (SRN)

International coordination action (ICA)

Budget: 12k EUR/year

Duration: 5 years

Minimum SRN requirements:

- Three research groups from at least two eligible
   Flemish host institutions
- Two research groups from the French-speaking community and/or abroad → UK research groups can be easily included: 31 (54%) of the SRN running on 01/01/2022 include at least one UK research group

2023 call: specific top-up possible funded by Universities Wales on behalf of the Global Wales Partnership: 2 of the 13 approved SRN included a Welsh research group

2024 SRN call opens in April with a deadline on September, 1st, 2024






#### Performance in EU framework programme

Based on **Lead Agency Procedure principle**: funder that receives proposal (the so-called Lead Agency) evaluates proposal according to internal rules set out for its respective national or regional programme open for collaborative Weave projects. Funding recommendation is then communicated to other funders involved (so-called Partner Agencies), for approval and budgetary purposes.






















### Weave Projects
